Then if anyone stays I intend to possibly do a few of the North Yorks forest trails and steadily meander my way home maybe, trying to find new lanes on the way!

All lanes have been checked on Trailwise and all are currently fine for motor vehicles, however a couple only have minimal information on them, going back ten years or so .. which means that as we can't recce the whole route beforehand we might have to turn round once or twice.

The first two lanes, within a mile of the start, are Tidal river crossings, perfectly legal fords, so a lot will depend on the state of the tide at the time. I will be recceing these two on Friday afternoon/evening and will make a decision whether we include these or not on the day .. the first could be a turn-around. Wetroads says one is good, one is a beeatch .. ;)
